

#411 Machine Stipple Quilting and Much More! Supply List

- SEWING MACHINE- bring instruction manual, extension bar or table and all accessories
- **An important reminder! Bring your sewing machines foot pedal and power cord with you to the workshop.**
- DARNING FOOT- a MUST for free motion quilting
(Sue prefers an open toe darning foot)
- Straight stitch throat plate- optional, bring if you have one
- Four 12” squares muslin
- Four 12” squares cotton or cotton blend batting
- Thread- 50 weight cotton in off white and tan or gray (I use Mettler 50/3 and Aurifil 50/2 or Masterpiece by Superior Threads 50/2)
- Optional decorative threads (variegated, etc.)
- Sewing machine needles- I use 80/12 microtex sharp for 50 weight cotton
- Needles for decorative thread
- 50 safety pins- I use size 0 or 1
- Rubber gloves- kitchen dishwashing gloves, size smaller than you wear.
- Marking pencil- I use Quilter’s Choice, silver
- Ruler for marking straight lines, approx. 12”
- Basic sewing supplies- scissors or snips, bobbins, etc.
- Extension cord
- Optional, but a good idea- small cushion for height, extra light

Project-

- Nine 7 ½” squares cotton fabric in solids or tone on tone print
(Piece this into a nine patch, I used 5 squares one fabric and 4 squares another fabric.)
*see note below
- One 25” square for backing fabric
- One 25” square cotton or cotton blend batting
- Thread for project
- Baste this quilt project before coming to class
- *Please note, you can use one piece of fabric for the top (cut 21” square) and mark with straight lines to indicate the nine-patch to save time.
