

Appliqué Elements: Fun Flowers

All levels- 1 day

In this workshop explore raw edge machine appliqué while making an easy fun flower quilt project. Using designs from the new “Appliqué Elements” patterns developed by Sue and her sister, Pat Holly make a fun and unique project while learning award winning machine appliqué skills. Take floral elements to create your own unique designs. This is an easy approach to create your own original quilt, without having to draw anything yourself! Students will work on one block in class, but will receive ideas for many more blocks.

Supply List

- Sewing Machine- blanket stitch used, can use zigzag stitch.
- **An important reminder! Bring your sewing machines foot pedal and power cord with you to the workshop.**
- Open Toe Appliqué Foot- a **must** for machine appliqué (this is sometimes called an open toe embroidery foot, it is the #20 foot on a Bernina)
- Small scissors- good for precise cutting of appliqué pieces
- 1 yard paper backed fusible web- lightweight
- Basic Sewing Supplies- pins, hand sewing needle, extra bobbins, pencil
- Spray Starch (background block can be starched at home- then you won't need starch in class)
- Fabric:
 - 100% cotton (I pre-wash my fabrics)
 - 14” square for background
 - Fabric for floral appliqué- 5-6 fat 1/4 's
- Thread: 50 weight cotton colors to coordinate with appliqué fabric
- Iron and small ironing board (one for every 4-5 students)
- Extension cord and extra light

Please note: We will work on one block in class- the yardages given are for one block. Our quilt has four blocks plus sashing and borders, if you want to make this size, you will need to purchase more yardage.

Sue appliquéd and quilted her quilt with her Superior Tone on Tone threads- they will be available for sale in class. Steam a Seam Lite paper backed fusible web will also be available for purchase.
